#### **News**

Unfortunately the horrendous weather on Sunday the 13<sup>th</sup> May meant that the planned outing to Gleniffer Braes Country Park to look for Green hairstreak butterflies was cancelled. There are a few historic records of Green hairstreak on this site but no sightings have been made recently, so a determined effort to check this area out is needed. Perhaps we can try again next year and maybe this time we will be luckier with the weather.

The outing to look for Purple hairstreak butterflies at Shaw Wood on the 12<sup>th</sup> August was fortunately more successful. In total 11 members of the society turned up for this outing and after a long wait of an hour and a half, we were rewarded with an aerial display of at least 6 individual butterflies flitting in and out of the tree canopy, well worth the wait.

Our first evening talk of the season is from Kate Sampson of the National Trust for Scotland, Arran Ranger Service. Kate was due to give this talk way back in February 2011, but couldn't get across the water due to bad weather. However, we were treated to a talk on Basking sharks by Dr Mauvis Gore instead. Anyway let's hope things go more smoothly this time.

Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> September 'Goatfell – Everything but the Goats' by Kate Sampson, National Trust for Scotland – Arran Ranger Service
