"Hunters, Munchers and Management" by Richard Clarkson (Manager, NTS Grey Mare's Tail Nature Reserve)

The Grey Mare's Tail Nature Reserve is best known for its spectacular waterfall, its dramatic scenery and its diversity of wildlife.

This talk will provide an overview of the reserve from Peregrine Falcons to grazing animals, highlighting the many different facets of managing an upland reserve.
