Unfortunately *Flyback* our Tag-n-Track sponsored gull has died. *Flyback* was the first gull to be hand caught at Castle Semple for the Tag-n-Track project, migrating all the way to Morocco over the winter and spotted back at the Loch in April this year. He appeared to be doing well but, at the start of July the Tag-n-Track team noticed that his tag hadn't been updating and identified a cluster of points near the Kaims Dam at the back of Lochwinnoch.

On investigation, the remains of *Flyback* were found under power lines suggesting a collision with the lines had been the cause of death. Although unable to find his tag the team did retrieve his colour ring.

However, despite this sad news, *Flyback* has contributed greatly to the project and the team will continue to update us on the other participants in this project.

Using this tiny mollusc as an example, the project aims to highlight the importance of freshwater habitats for invertebrates whilst also creating a healthier and more resilient population of the Pond mud snail in Scotland.
